



Aaron Dean Returns as Presenter for the ABC and MSA with Five Seminars

On September 19, Aaron presented How Contractors Can Get Paid on Time and in Full in Fargo, North Dakota. This 90-minute seminar focused on important construction contract terms and payment remedies under North Dakota and Minnesota law.

On October 22, Aaron presented Protecting Your Company's Safety Record at Actalent's West End office in St. Louis Park, Minnesota. This 90-minute seminar focused on how to handle OSHA inspections and defend OSHA Citations.
