



## Advantage CLE: Protecting the Privilege: Ethical Duties, Practical Pitfalls, and Professional Responsibility

The discussion will address real world scenarios illustrating how actions and inaction by counsel, managers, and employees can lead to unintended and, sometimes, irreversible waiver of privilege. The program will also analyze the ethical consequences of both proper and improper assertion of privilege, including risks to client interests, professional discipline exposure, and reputational harm, and will provide best practice guidance for ethically safeguarding privilege in today's workplace.
