In the article, originally a firm [blog post](#), the team explains that a federal court has halted recent CDC vaccine policy changes, temporarily restoring prior immunization guidance while litigation continues. The dispute centers on the overhaul of the CDC advisory committee and shifts in vaccine recommendations, which challengers argue violated federal administrative and advisory committee requirements. For now, the ruling creates temporary stability but leaves broader uncertainty about how future vaccine policy will be set and enforced.

“In the context of the broader legal landscape, many of the recent administrative actions by federal agencies are being invalidated in the courts. The government has been unable to provide sufficient administrative records in support of a number of agency decisions across many agencies. In many cases, they can go back and re-do the action more deliberately, building out a stronger administrative record,” the team wrote.
