



Jacob Hollars Examines Significance of Colorado Supreme Court Eviction Case in Dual Publications

"Most notably, the assertion of such a defense could dramatically prolong the eviction process," he noted in both publications. "As discovery into the alleged discrimination and retaliation would likely become necessary prior to proceeding to a hearing on possession."
