



Jessie Merrigan Explores Cooperative Federalism at REGFORM Water Seminar

Spencer Fane attorney [Jessica Merrigan](#) led the session Strengthening Cooperative Federalism and the Impact of the Criminal Enforcement Executive Order at the 2025 Missouri Water Seminar on July 30 in Columbia, Missouri. The firm co-sponsored the two-day Regulatory Environmental Group for Missouri (REGFORM) event.

Jessie's presentation examined the impact of the president's May 9 Criminal Executive Order concerning overcriminalization – which declared the U.S. “drastically overregulated” – on regulatory enforcement. She focused on key legal principles, including the level of intent required for criminal liability and how negligence is assessed in these cases, and also explored Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Administrator Lee Zeldin's strategy surrounding federal and state government collaboration.
