



John Watson Highlights Impact of the Wind Energy Memorandum in POWER Magazine

In the article, which originated as a firm [blog post](#), John discusses the Trump Administration's Wind Energy Memorandum that was designed to halt development of wind power in the U.S. The court found that federal agencies implemented the directive without adequate explanation or consideration of existing policies and reliance interests. As a result, the executive action and related agency measures were declared unlawful and vacated.

"After concluding that both the state and industry plaintiffs had 'standing' to pursue their claims, and that the agencies' actions were 'final' for purposes of appeal under the APA, the district court readily embraced one of the fundamental challenges by plaintiffs that focused on (1) the failure of the agencies to offer any explanation for the delays and disruptions to wind-energy permitting and development, other than referencing the Wind Memo, and (2) that the agencies failed to provide a reasoned explanation for the 'sharp reversal of federal policy or decisions regarding wind-energy development,'" John wrote.
