During the session, Sound-a-like Issues: From *Midler v. Ford Motor Co.* to *Astley v. Hauri*, Loren moderated a discussion between Suzanne Kessler, Loeb & Loeb's Tim Warnock, and Mandell Menkes' Peter Strand about the lawsuit singer Rick Astley recently filed against rapper Yung Gravy. The panelists analyzed the development of the doctrine prohibiting the creation and use of a person's voice without permission and also discussed the application of those concepts to the use and misuse of Al.
