



## Randi Winter Discusses Workplace Civility and Upcoming Spencer Fane Webinar in the Star Tribune

The presentation – *Myth Busters and Hot Button Issues: From the 2024 Election to the Israeli Hamas Conflict, Breaking Down How Employers Should Deal with Hot Button Issues in the Workplace* – is one of three sessions comprising the September 18 virtual event. It will examine laws relevant to workplace discussion of social and political topics, provide best practices for resolving conflicts between employees, and address how employers can promote respectful dialogue.
