



Shawn Tuma Outlines Consumer Privacy Cases Against “Big Tech” in Bloomberg Law

“They’re trying to send a message to Texas businesses that we take very seriously the protection of informational privacy for Texas residents and we’re going to enforce it,” Shawn shared with Bloomberg. “That’s been their big goal for the year.”
