Shawn said. "And so much of what we do in incident response is about logistics. Do we know our team? Do we have our team? Do we know what their roles are? Do we know what each other's roles are? Who can do the things that need to be done, and how do we reach them when we need them?"

The event provides an opportunity for 200 cybersecurity leaders to network and have honest and critical conversations focusing on the unique challenges underrepresented talent has in the cybersecurity profession.
