She addressed the mental health crisis sweeping the nation and advised employers on minimizing the chances of ADA discrimination lawsuits while generating a positive impact in the workforce. Topics included when and how mental health conditions trigger disability laws; providing necessary

workplace accommodations; and best practices to comply with the ADA, FMLA, and other interacting laws.
