- Obtained a jury verdict in the Denton County District Court for breach of fiduciary duty, fraud, and breach of contract, and damages awarded of \$649,568.85, in a matter involving violations of duties by a company's former president. The court further awarded an additional \$548,177.43 as equitable disgorgement.
